- 4. It is very much imperative that you maintain both internal and external silence all through the annual retreat.

In fine, kindly consider the annual retreat NOT as a burden, but as a GREAT OPPORTUNITY to renew yourselves internally and spiritually. I assure you of my prayerful support to enable you to reap a great spiritual harvest by means of the retreat to be made by you.
